DR. JOHN KNIGHT is Professor Emeritus of Conducting and Ensembles and Music Education at Oberlin Conservatory, Oberlin, Ohio. A member of the Oberlin Conservatory community since 1978, he served as chairman of the Conducting Division for many years, retiring in 2013. John received his baccalaureate degree from the University of Central Arkansas and masters and doctoral degrees from Louisiana State University. He is a guest conductor of professional orchestras and bands, all state and honor ensembles throughout the

United States, Europe, and Asia at such venues as the Sir Adrian Boult Hall in Birmingham, England; Severance Hall, Cleveland, Ohio; Chicago Orchestra Hall; and in 2016 in Carnegie Hall, New York.

Dr. Knight is on the board of directors for The Instrumentalist magazine where he has had over 100 published articles on conducting. For his articles he received the Citation of Excellence for creative writing from the Educational Press Association of America. Dr. Knight is the author of The Interpretive Wind Band Conductor published by Meredith Music Publications in 2007, which is devoted to the conducting pedagogy needed for the interpretation of major concert band repertoire, and The Golden Age of Conductors, published by Meredith in 2010, which is an interpretive analysis of musical masterworks by twenty great maestros from Arturo Toscanini to Carlos Kleiber. John is also co-author of the popular textbook "Prelude to Music Education," published by Prentice Hall which is used in college classrooms throughout the USA.



LAURA PEDERSEN is a versatile, internationally-acclaimed American singer who brings an exciting lyric soprano voice and beauty to opera houses and concert halls around the world. The breadth and depth of her repertoire are staggering, including Georgetta in Il Tabarro, Knoxville: Summer of 1915, and the soprano solo in Faurè's Requiem performed at Carnegie Hall. Laura has made multiple tours of Scotland, most recently to sing a world premiere and record the newly expanded version as Flora in Flora and the Prince as an Oratorio, she sang

Mahler's Second in Fresno, Tosca for Atlanta Opera, and gave concerts and masterclasses with Harp and Heels across the country. She has also appeared with Indianapolis Opera, Cleveland Opera, Di Capo Opera, Opera Delaware, Florida Opera, Sacramento Opera, Panama Opera, Atlantic Opera, Opera Project Columbus. Highlights from those companies include the roles of Donna Anna, Nedda, Santuzza, Hanna Glawari (one of her Merry Widow productions was broadcast live for Public Radio), Mimi, Musetta, Violetta, Susannah, Juliette, Rosalinda, Donna Anna, Donna Elvira, Musetta, Antonia, and Micaela. No matter when or where she performs, Laura has the rare ability to make each role come alive on stage.

Ms. Pedersen spent four years in Bremen, Germany singing countless performances, singing at least six leading roles each season in the performances ranging from well-known beloved operas like Norina in Don Paquale, to yearly musicals like Maria in Bernstein's West Side Story and World Premieres of annually commissioned Operas.

Ms. Pedersen has sung and continues to solo with countless symphonies and orchestras internationally, as well as doing ongoing concerts with her dynamic duo Harp and Heels.

THE PATRIOTS SYMPHONIC BAND is one of northeast Ohio's largest and most active nonprofit, all-volunteer music organizations. The Band's members, who are drawn from more than 25 communities across northeast Ohio, range in age from the teens to the lower nineties. The Band has performed at Severance Hall, Cleveland State University, Baldwin Wallace University, the Sandusky State Theatre, numerous summer concert series locations, the 2003, 2009, 2014, and 2017 OMEA/MENC Professional Conferences in Cleveland and Columbus, as well as many other venues inside and outside northeast Ohio.

Formed in 1977, the Patriots maintain a tradition of providing the local community with fun and enriching music in the form of an American-style, hometown concert band. The Patriots routinely provide musical entertainment for civic events, festivals, and concert programs. The Band strives to provide access to the musical performing arts and to encourage both youth and adults to pursue playing and performing music. The Patriots Band members voluntarily contribute a wealth of solo and ensemble talent to demonstrate that playing a musical instrument can be an enjoyable lifetime experience.
