DR. JOHN KNIGHT is Professor Emeritus of Conducting and Ensembles and Music Education at Oberlin Conservatory, Oberlin, Ohio. A member of the Oberlin Conservatory community since 1978, he served as chairman of the Conducting Division for many years, retiring in 2013. Dr. Knight received his baccalaureate degree from the University of Central Arkansas and masters and doctoral degrees from Louisiana State University. He is a guest conductor of professional orchestras and bands, all state and honor

ensembles throughout the United States, Europe, and Asia at such venues as the Sir Adrian Boult Hall in Birmingham, England; Severance Hall, Cleveland, Ohio; Chicago Orchestra Hall; and in 2016 in Carnegie Hall, New York.

Dr. Knight is on the board of directors for The Instrumentalist magazine where he has had over 100 published articles on conducting. For his articles he received the Citation of Excellence for creative writing from the Educational Press Association of America. Dr. Knight is the author of The Interpretive Wind Band Conductor published by Meredith Music Publications in 2007, which is devoted to the conducting pedagogy needed for the interpretation of major concert band repertoire, and The Golden Age of Conductors, published by Meredith in 2010, which is an interpretive analysis of musical masterworks by twenty great maestros from Arturo Toscanini to Carlos Kleiber. Dr. Knight is also co-author of the popular textbook "Prelude to Music Education," published by Prentice Hall which is used in college classrooms throughout the USA.

THE PATRIOTS SYMPHONIC BAND, established in 1977 as an Americanstyle hometown concert band, has been providing fun and enriching music to the community for nearly 50 years! The Band, one of the largest and most active non-profit music organizations, draws its volunteer musicians from more than 25 communities across northeast Ohio. Band members range in age from their teens to their nineties demonstrating that playing an instrument is an enjoyable lifelong experience.

The Patriots Band plays several concerts each year and has performed in local town squares and schools as well as Severance Hall and at several Ohio Music Educators Association professional conferences. The Band provides fun and enriching music to both listeners and musicians.
